

### **Grupo Bimbo moves towards 100% cage-free egg supply**

In 2015, we committed to gradually move towards a 100% cage-free bird egg supply. We have now made significant progress towards achieving our goal.

Since 2015, we have been working closely with our partners to incorporate animal welfare production practices in the markets we operate.

It is important to note that we have carried out this process with the support of our allies and various civil society organizations that are experts in the field, including *Humane Society International* (HSI), who have provided us with information and recommendations.

To meet our target by 2025, in 2023, we achieved 17% progress on our global target, exceeding the 15% originally projected. Our progress plan for the coming years is as follows:

The progress plans to meet this goal have been affected by conditions beyond Grupo Bimbo's control that have impacted the global context and the supply market for this type of egg, such as avian flu, the COVID-19 pandemic and armed and social conflicts in various parts of the world.

Also, since 2015, the expansion of Grupo Bimbo includes the presence in 12 new countries, forcing us to rethink the work plans and the implementation of actions that were not originally contemplated in our commitment. In this context, our efforts have focused on those markets where our consumption is most relevant.

Among the actions we have undertaken to achieve our goal, we highlight:

- a) Training workshops for associates.
- b) Accompaniment and training for producers with whom we have commercial relationships.
- c) Identifying producers (together with HSI) with the capacity to transition to 100% cage-free poultry eggs.
- d) Collaboration with other companies committed.
